# About the Management Team members

**Kim Stewart** is the Chief Operating Officer. She oversees administration, board relations and safety while managing human resources for the co-op's employees. Stewart is a Southern Illinois University graduate with 32 years of experience in the HR field, including 6 years since joining the EnerStar team in 2018. **Kira Taylor** became part of the co-op family in December 2023 as the Chief Financial Officer. She earned a bachelor's degree in accounting and a master's degree in business administration from Eastern Illinois University. She is a Certified Public Accountant with over 20 years of accounting and auditing experience.

**Angela Griffin** is the Manager of Marketing and Communications and has recently taken on the CEO role. She has been a member of the co-op family since 1989, after graduating from Indiana State University.

**Dave Clinton** joined EnerStar in 2018 as its Chief Financial Officer (CFO) and accepted the role of CEO in 2022. Clinton has had a long career in the rural electric cooperative industry, beginning in 1978 and spanning the states of Washington, Virginia and concluding in Illinois. He recently retired from the CEO role and will assist the co-op during the CEO transition. **Greg Hollingsworth** was welcomed back to EnerStar in 2022 as Manager of Engineering and Operations and is responsible for the reliability of the co-op's electric infrastructure. Greg had previously worked at EnerStar from 1988 to 2008 as a journeyman lineman, eventually serving as foreman.

**Shannon Quinn** is the Manager of Information Technology and joined the co-op in 2023. Shannon attended SIU Carbondale and joined the co-op family after four years at the Illinois Department of Transportation, where he served as a utilities coordinator. Before that, he worked in IT/GIS at the Edgar County Highway Department.

# EnerStar CEO role update



#### **Dave Clinton retires**

EnerStar CEO Dave Clinton retired Nov. 1, 2024. Throughout Clinton's varied career, his roles have included Chief Financial Officer, Chief Executive Officer, co-op industry lobbyist, and crisis manager. Recently, he led team efforts to develop

EnerStar's long-range strategic plan.

Regarding his co-op legacy, "I feel I can best describe my career as simply listening to the challenges and needs of people and then using a servant-leadership strategy to develop and implement positive changes," said Clinton. "Those solutions will last long after I have moved on to the next challenge."

Clinton will stay with the cooperative through the transition period until the end of the year. He will assist the management team in developing the co-op's financial budget and with several other projects, including future rate strategies and load control programs.



#### **Griffin named CEO**

Succeeding Clinton as CEO will be long-term EnerStar employee Angela Griffin. Griffin has over 35 years of diverse experience in the cooperative sector. In 2016, Griffin completed the National Rural Electric Cooperative's Management

Internship Program at the University of Wisconsin and has since participated in ongoing co-op training at the state and national levels. Throughout her career, she has served on numerous local nonprofit boards. She currently serves on the board of directors for the Paris Economic Development Corporation.

"During my interview, one question asked was, "Which of the seven cooperative principles is most important to you?" While I value all of them, Commitment to Community stands out the most to me," said Griffin. "I take great pride in our local co-op roots, our dedication to the communities we serve, and the co-op memberowners." Griffin added that most co-op employees work here and live here. They are equally committed to serving our co-op membership.

Griffin explained that the electric utility is rapidly evolving. Alongside this transformation, the cooperative has experienced several changes, including the retirement of many long-term employees. She credited the strong management team under Clinton's leadership for leading the cooperative through this period by focusing on training and developing a long-term strategic plan.

Griffin emphasized that the co-op's members can rely on its core values. "Safety, stability and member service will always be our top priorities," Griffin concluded.
